1. Staff Meeting

On the afternoon of 6th November, I was invited to attend the prize-presenting ceremony of the 15th Wong Tai Sin District Outstanding Student Election organized by the East Kowloon Youth Society and Wong Tai Sin District Outstanding Students Association. Li Chit Wing was awarded the ‘Outstanding Student of the Senior Secondary Section’ and ‘Social Service Award’ and Sung Hin Man was awarded the ‘Outstanding Student of the Junior Secondary Section’ out of more than 200 participants in the contest.

13. Report from Subject Departments

Mathematics Department

- (1) On 12th November, 4D Cheng Wing Yan, Chan Pok Shun, Choi Tsz Yau and Ng Ka Man represented our school to participate in the True Light Mathematics Competition organized by Hong Kong True Light Middle School. Our school team was awarded the overall second runner-up. Cheng Wing Yan and Chan Pok Shun got merit in the competition
- (2) The Mathematics Society organized an activity ‘Monthly Mathematics Challenge’ to arouse students’ interest in Mathematics. The winners for November were To Chun Hin (3D) and Chow Mei Sze (4D).
- (3) On 17th November, an online Mathematics talk with the topic ‘Courtroom in Mathematics’ was organized. Dr. Law Wing Cheung, the Associate Professor of the Department of Mathematics was invited to explain the concept of using probability for the analysis of the judgment of court cases. Eighty-five students joined the talk.
- (4) Mathematics Department organized Mathematics Competition Training Classes (Ms. Chu Ka Man and Mr. Tai Tze Tik were responsible for training the students) for the following participants:

- (1) Hok Yau Club Mock Examination for English Language, Chinese Language and Mathematics were held on 16-17th and 21st-24th November. 8 F.6 students participated in the Chinese mock examination, 22 students in English Language and 32 students in Mathematics. The mock examinations were held on the school campus for students to experience working in a public examination setting.
- (2) Learning Support Tutorial (Nov-Dec 2022) for Mathematics and English started on 4th November via Google Meet. S.1-5 interested students joined the after-school classes. The batch includes 5 sessions held on every Thursday.
- (3) Elective subject sharing videos by alumni were published on 21st November. The video contents focus on the experience sharing on how to prepare for the DSE examination. The videos are stored in Google Drive so F.5 students can watch them at their convenience.
- (4) A notetaking workshop was held on 24th November. 9 F.1 students joined the activity. During the workshop, the Academic Prefects talked about notetaking and timetabling skills.
