## 7. Report from Subject Departments

### **Mathematics Department**

- (1) On 21 October, the Mathematics Department and the Physics Department have a meeting with Education University to discuss the progress of the development of the AI Assessment System. Mr. Li WK, Mr. Lam HK and Mr. Chan TY attended the meeting.
- (2) On 6, 13, 20 & 27 October for S.1 participants and on 11, 18 & 25 October for S.2 – S.4 participants, Mathematics Olympic Training Classes for junior and senior form students started in October. Ms. Chu Ka Man and Mr. Tai Tze Tik were the coordinators.
- (3) From October onwards, the Mathematics Society is conducting the ‘Monthly Mathematics Challenge’ to arouse students’ interest in Mathematics. The winners for October were Wong Tik (3E) and Choy Ka Ki (3C).
- (4) On 25 and 26 October, the Mathematics Society and Chinese Language Society jointly organized an activity to introduce the Counting of Chinese Figures to promote their interest in learning Mathematics.
- (5) Our students participated in the Thailand International Mathematics Olympiad 2022-2023 (Hong Kong Selection Competition).

  - S.6 students attended talks delivered by representatives from the Hong Kong Metropolitan University, The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong, the School of Professional and Continuing Education, The University of Hong Kong, and The Hong Kong Polytechnic University - Hong Kong Community College to learn more about the programmes the institutions offered.

This will help them prepare for their future. There were opportunities for students to consult teachers and social workers about the planning of their future studies.

- (4) An information package on Multiple Pathways for S.6 students was prepared. The S.6 class teachers used this package to introduce information on careers and further study to parents.
- (5) Two S.6 students were recommended to attend the Practicum Scheme in Greater Bay Area for DSE students.
